

<u>Alyssa Strege Memorial</u>

Donors with a heart for the ministry of Covenant Christian High School have contributed funds to help pay tuition for students with specific needs and demonstrated characteristics. These scholarships are administered by the Scholarship Committee in accordance with the donors' criteria. To qualify for the Alyssa Strege Memorial Scholarship, applicant must submit all requirements to the CCHS Scholarship Committee, as well as apply for financial aid. Deadline is March 15.

Award Criteria:

- A one-year, \$1,000 scholarship awarded annually to two students.
- Available to students entering their sophomore, junior or senior years at Covenant.
- Applicant must currently be a participant in Covenant's Volunteer Work Study Program.
- Applicant must demonstrate a strong desire to obtain a Covenant education.
- Students may reapply annually.
- Need-based. The applicant's parents/guardians must apply for financial aid by April 15.
- Student essay required.
- Essay due by March 15.

<u>1 John 3:17 Scholarship</u>

Donors with a heart for the ministry of Covenant Christian High School have contributed funds to establish scholarships for Covenant students. These scholarships are administered by the Scholarship Committee in accordance with the donors' criteria. To qualify for the 1 John 3:17, an applicant must submit all requirements to the Covenant Scholarship Committee. Deadline is March 15.

1 John 3:17 offers a lesson in a Christians willingness to help others with the material resources they have been blessed with. These donors possess a vision, conviction and passion for educating young people about the truths of Jesus Christ in an environment of grace. The scholarship has been established with that verse in mind to orient students and their families to receive help in this opportunity and then consider how they might look for ways to bless others as well.

Scholarship Criteria:

- Family must demonstrate a desire to attend Covenant and be enrolled
- Family must demonstrate a high need for financial aid through need-based aid application process
- Family cannot be a recipient of any other donor-based scholarships (i.e. Hannah More, Hudson
- A four-year, \$1,000 \$2,000 scholarship awarded annually to 1-2 students.
- Available to incoming and current students

- Renewed each year if the student maintains a 3.3 GPA or higher with no significant behavior issues
- Student essay required. Student must communicate in 300 words or less
 - 1) Why they want to attend Covenant, or stay at Covenant.
 - 2) How they feel Covenant is offering them a better opportunity in life.
- Essay and recommendations due by March 15.

Tony and Sandy Johnson Scholarship

Donors with a heart for the ministry of Covenant Christian High School have contributed funds in celebration of the work of Tony and Sandy Johnson. These scholarships are established for Covenant students and administered by the Scholarship Committee in accordance with the donors' criteria. To qualify for the Tony and Sandy Johnson Scholarship, applicant must submit all requirements to the Covenant Scholarship Committee. Deadline is March 15.

Tony and Sandy Johnson have made an incredible impact for the Kingdom through their efforts in ministries like Covenant and the local church. Tony was a board member at Covenant and a pastor at Ben Davis Christian Church for many years, with Sandy leading and serving at both places by his side. Tony and Sandy are passionate about Christ-centered education and they are strong believers in the impact the local church can have on its community.

Award Criteria:

- A one-year scholarship awarded annually to 1-2 students.
- This scholarship can range from \$1,000-\$2,500 depending upon the student need and number of applicants
- Available to any current or incoming student.
- Previous year recipients may apply again each year
- High priority given to a student who is a member at Ben Davis Christian Church
- High priority given to a student who is the child of a full-time pastor
- 400 words or less on the context and impact of Joshua 24:15. How should Christ be the center of our daily rhythms?
- Essay with recommendations due by March 15.

<u>Brian C. Hudson</u>

Donors with a heart for the ministry of Covenant Christian High School have contributed funds to establish scholarships for Covenant students. These scholarships are administered by the Scholarship Committee in accordance with the donors' criteria. To qualify for the Brian C. Hudson Scholarship, applicant must submit all requirements to the Covenant Scholarship Committee. Deadline is March 15.

Brian Hudson, former principal and CEO of Covenant Christian High School, made an enduring impact on the culture of the Covenant community and in the lives of countless students who have experienced a Covenant education. Brian possessed a vision, conviction and passion for educating young people about the truths of Jesus Christ in an environment of grace. The scholarship has been established in Brian's name to be awarded to a young person who most embodies the ideals that Brian so passionately desired for Covenant students.

The Brian C. Hudson Scholarship reflects Covenant Christian High School's desire to develop students whose minds are enlightened, hearts inflamed and lives transformed through Christian education. This scholarship will reward and recognize a student, like Brian, who fiercely delights in learning, has an insatiable curiosity about the world God has created, and diligently seeks relationships and conversations with like-hearted friends which create an opportunity to impact the kingdom for Christ.

Award Criteria:

- A one-year, \$1,000 scholarship awarded annually to one student.
- Available to current Covenant students entering their sophomore, junior or senior years.
- Previous year recipients may not apply in future years.
- Student essay required. Mr. Hudson was fond of exuberantly exhorting those around him to "fiercely delight" in everything from a good book to a great meal. In the required essay, the student shall describe in no more than 250 words how he or she "fiercely delights" in learning here at Covenant Christian High School.
- Recommendation letter from two current teachers. The applicant must send the reference link below to the teachers, in order for them to complete the required submission on line.
- Essay and recommendations due by March 15.

Christian Ministry Scholarship

Donors with a heart for the ministry of Covenant Christian High School have contributed funds to help pay tuition for students with specific needs and demonstrated characteristics. These scholarships are administered by the Scholarship Committee in accordance with the donors' criteria. To qualify for the Christian Ministry Scholarship, applicant must submit all requirements to the Covenant Scholarship Committee, as well as apply for financial aid. Deadline is March 15.

Award Criteria:

- Available to Covenant students entering all grade levels.
- The applicant must be the student of a full-time, vocational Christian
- Worker defined as follows: a pastor on the ministry staff of a local church;
- A long-term, teaching missionary; or a Christian educator teaching Bible Theology Studies full-time at the high school level or above.
- Students may reapply annually.
- The amount is determined by need.
- The applicant's parents/guardians must apply for financial aid by April 15.
- The applicant shall comment briefly regarding the ministry of their parents.
- Application is due by March 15.

<u>Elaine M. Goodwin</u>

Donors with a heart for the ministry of Covenant Christian High School have contributed funds to establish scholarships for Covenant students. These scholarships are administered by the Scholarship Committee in accordance with the donors' criteria. To qualify for the Elaine M. Goodwin Memorial Scholarship, applicant must submit all requirements to the Covenant Scholarship Committee. Deadline is March 15.

Award Criteria:

- A one-year, \$500 scholarship awarded annually to one student.
- Available to Covenant students entering all grade levels.
- The applicant must be a member of Chapel Rock Christian Church who has demonstrated scholarship and service.
- Students may reapply annually.
- The applicant shall write an essay in no more than 250 words about the importance of being a servant scholar.
- Recommendation from a Chapel Rock pastor. The applicant must send the reference link below to the pastor, in order for them to complete the required submission on line.
- Essay and recommendation due by March 15.

<u>The Founder's</u>

Donors with a heart for the ministry of Covenant Christian High School have contributed funds to establish scholarships for Covenant students. These scholarships are administered by the Scholarship Committee in accordance with the donors' criteria. To qualify for The Founders' Scholarship, the applicant must submit all requirements to the Covenant Scholarship Committee. Deadline is March 15.

The Founders' Scholarship honors God's transforming impact at Covenant Christian High School through those individuals who had a vision for Covenant Christian High School, which led to Covenant being established in 1994. The founders have provided leadership throughout the years, in addition to the funds for the current facility. They have consistently used their talents and influence for the glory of God and the good of those in the communities they serve. Matthew 5:16 has been modeled by Covenant's founders, "Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."

Award Criteria:

- A one-year, \$1,500 scholarship awarded annually to two students.
- Available to current Covenant students entering their sophomore, junior, or senior years.
- Previous year recipients may not apply in future years.
- Need-based. The applicant's parents/guardians must apply for financial aid by March 15.
- The applicant shall write an essay in no more than 250 words describing how they live out the words of Matthew 5:16.
- Essay due by March 15.

Gone Servin' Community Service

Donors with a heart for the ministry of Covenant Christian High School have contributed funds to help pay tuition for students with specific needs and demonstrated characteristics. These scholarships are administered by the Scholarship Committee in accordance with the donors' criteria.

To qualify for the Gone Servin' Community Service Scholarship, applicant must submit all requirements to the Covenant Scholarship Committee, as well as apply for financial aid. Deadline is March 15.

Award Criteria:

- A one-year, \$500 scholarship awarded annually to four students.
- Available to Covenant students entering all grade levels.
- Applicant must be an outstanding student and active in community service.
- Students may reapply annually.
- Need-based. The applicant's parents/guardians must apply for financial aid by April 15.
- The applicant shall write an essay in no more than 250 words describing their community service involvement, during the last twelve months.
- Essay is due by March 15.

Chick-Fil-A Leadership Scholarship

Chick-Fil-A, in a partnership with Covenant Christian High School, has contributed funds to establish a scholarship for Covenant students. These scholarships are administered by the Scholarship Committee in accordance with the donor's criteria. To qualify for the Chick-Fil-A Leadership Scholarship, an applicant must meet all the requirements and submit an application to the Covenant Scholarship Committee.

Chick-Fil-A wants to emphasize faith based learning and believes that leadership is a result of service toward other people. It is an organization that values generous giving, supporting the community, and valuing the lives of young people in education. The scholarship has been established to be awarded to a young person who demonstrates a strong work ethic in the classroom but is also in service to other people.

Students must have at least a 3.0 GPA, while also maintaining some kind of employment outside of school. Please demonstrate proof in some way to verify both of these requirements in your application.

Award Criteria:

- A one-year, \$500 scholarship awarded annually to one student.
- Available to current Covenant students entering their sophomore, junior or senior years.
- Applicant must have at least a 3.0 GPA.

- Applicant must maintain some kind of employment outside of school.
- Applicants currently working at a Chick-Fil-A will be given special consideration.
- Students may reapply annually.
- The applicant shall write an essay in no more than 500 words describing how they have been able to lead/serve in both their school setting and a work environment.
- Recommendation letters from one current teacher and one current employer. The applicant must send the reference link below to the individuals, in order for them to complete the required submission on line.
- Essay and recommendations due by March 15.

Hannah More Scholarships

These four-year scholarships are awarded to incoming freshmen who have matriculated from the **Oaks Academy.** To apply, students will read a biography about Hannah More and write a 500-word essay on her life.

Award Criteria:

- Multiple essay contest winners will be selected by our Scholarship committee.
- All Hannah More scholarships are renewable for four years, provided students maintain at least a 3.0 GPA each semester at Covenant, and submit an annual 500-word essay on an assigned historical role model.
- Hannah More Scholarship Awards are renewable, and will range from \$1,000 to \$8,000 annually.
- Applications are due by March 15th and can be completed by filling out the form below.
